Local Western Australian charity, Autism West, recently moved to a new location in Mosman Park.

The move sees Autism West lease premises from one of Western Australia's leading disability services providers, Rocky Bay, while retaining its independent status as a not for profit provider of services and support for families affected by autism.

Autism West is occupying a suite of three rooms in the Rocky Bay facility, providing a new home for the social and life skills programs the organisation provides, as well as space for Autism West's extensive library of books, games and developmental toys available to its members.

Additionally, the move gives Autism West the opportunity to share further resources with the Rocky Bay organisation including therapy space, function rooms, and access to the landscaped grounds in which Rocky Bay is located. 
THE NEW FACE OF ROTARY IN MOSMAN PARK
