Two 'first ladies' set to meet SAMANTHA MAIDEN

MICHELLE Obama will hold talks with Lucy Turnbull in New York this week.

The US President's wife, who made her first official appearance on the US campaign trail for Hillary Clinton overnight, has emerged as one of the Democrats' biggest weapons in the political race. Both she and the Australian Prime Minister's wife are former high-flying lawyers and philanthropists who are expected to discuss their charity work.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull will address the United Nations and hold talks with President Obama. Mr and Mrs Turnbull will also visit the 9/11 memorial in New York.

Mrs Obama has emerged as a heavyweight political player in the campaign to win the White House. Yesterday, she unloaded on Republican candidate Donald Trump in a speech in Fairfax, Virginia.

"If a candidate is erratic and threatening; if a candidate traffics in prejudice, fears and lies on the trail; if a candidate has no clear plans to implement their goals; if they disrespect their fellow citizens, including folks who made extraordinary sacrifices for our country; let me tell you, that is who they are," she said.
