

PARTNERSHIPS

Our partnerships ensure we can reach more people in need of services and that awareness can be spread to a wide net of sectors. They are key to driving cultural change in how the wider community perceives autism.

Together with our research partner **Curtin University** we have validated the strength-based approach around using strengths as an evidence based intervention for young people with autism.

Spectrum Space and **Autism CRC** began a partnership in 2015 to enable Spectrum Space to contribute to the national research centre. Since then, Spectrum Space has contributed to research into several aspects of the CRC's work including contributing to co-participation.

We offer space to **Be My Koorda**, the only organisation in Western Australia delivering culturally appropriate services to Aboriginal children with autism.

Spectrum Space has partnered with Harrier Human Capital to deliver training and awareness to organisations on how to successfully employ individuals with autism.
