What about lids?

If using the bin at Spectrum Space, lids should be removed and disposed of separately, no lids in the Containers for Change bin please!



If you are returning your container to a recycling centre you will need to return them separately. That means the lids must be off. During the recycle process if a lid is still on the container it can pop off and become a dangerous projectile!

Do I have to clean the container?

Yes, containers need to be empty and rinsed with water/cleaned.

Can crushed or damaged containers be returned?

Not for containers returned to the bin at Spectrum Space, they must be whole (not crushed or glass broken).

If you are returning your container to a recycling centre however, then yes. As long as the refund point operator can tell whether your container's refundable, your container can be returned. Even if it's crushed, even if it's missing a label, as long as it's empty and a whole container, then your container can be returned.

Unable to get to Spectrum Space and still want to donate?
